Prevention, Screening, and Outreach Opportunities 2016

Procedures for Procession of Abnormal Screening Results at Community Events:

- 1. Patient is contacted directly by screening coordinator to review results
- 2. A Copy of the Results is provided to the patient and also shared with patient's physician if so authorized
- 3. A letter detailing the screening results is also mailed to the patient's home.
- 4. Patient is advised to seek counsel of physician for further treatment and/or diagnosis. If the patient does not have a physician, the screening coordinator will assist in finding a suitable physician for a follow up appointment and assist in scheduling that appointment.
- 5. Abnormal Breast Cancer Screenings follows the same procedure and is referred to the Breast Care Center for the Nurse to Contact and schedule appropriate procedures. See Breast Care Center and Mammogram Policy and Procedures
